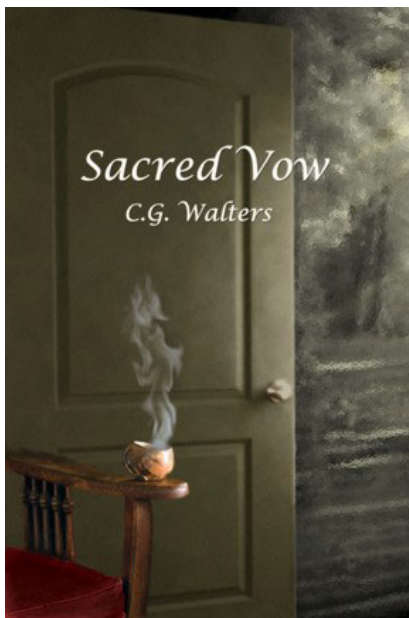

When I read fiction, it's to "escape" my current reality for a bit and enjoy an adventurous, mysterious, or dramatic journey or to momentarily re-experience those first feelings of falling in love and the strong yearnings attached to it. *Sacred Vow*, a work of visionary and metaphysical fiction, provides all of that as it shares a story of a loving bond between two people across parallel lives. I felt the strong love connection and yearning the two characters shared for one another. I traveled with the main character to various places – some beautiful, some scary. And I puzzled at the mysteries that began to unfold. Why couldn't they hear one another or feel each other's touch? Why were the "travels" beginning to affect them adversely on a physical level? What was the meaning of their encounters? What fun it has been to read this book!

After a casual conversation with his wife, the author pursued an idea that was originally to be a short story. But this was a story that really wanted to be told, and Walters finally accepted that it was to be a novel. There were many questions I wanted to ask Mr. Walters — mostly why he took certain directions in the book. The bottom line, however, was "It didn't give me any choice. It is what it is." He basically served as a conduit to get this incredible story on paper.

This book is not just about two soulmates finding one another across parallel lives; it's also about the one true connection we all have "that draws from us our fullest self."
